This year, the Human Rights Pavilion will transform into a space where the rich and the diverse cultural expressions of Morocco come to life. These expressions are not just about creativity, they are a powerful force for change and development. Indeed, they can nurture social cohesion, unlock economic opportunities, open doors to new ones, reminding us that the right to freedom of expression is fundamental to human dignity. This belief has shaped our journey from the very beginning; It's what we believed

in when we first launched this initiative and it's what we continue to believe in as we support cultural initiatives and engage to protect and promote them.

Culture and cultural rights are neither an elitist luxury nor merely a heritage to preserve in museums. It goes beyond our collective memory. It is an everlasting dialogue between the past, the present, and the future. It is one of the most powerful tools driving development and human rights promotion, particularly cultural rights. Through these expressions, people are empowered to imagine a better world... a world where rights are fully enjoyed by all, where identity and dignity are valorized, and where we have the right to be who we truly are.

Within our expressions, as I wholeheartedly believe, and never cease to repeat, lies the essence of our humanity: our constant need to create, to be free, and to belong. It is an

ongoing process and does not necessarily have an end.

In our unwavering support for cultural expressions is an invitation to reimagine both who we are and who we aspire to become as a society. Each form of art, with its richness and diversity, sows seeds in the soil of rights. From these seeds, we hope to cultivate a tree of development and rights in whose shade we shall all sit.

The protection, valorisation and promotion of these expressions stem not only from a commitment to uphold a human right. They also stem from the ambition to build a more inclusive, open, and innovative society- a society that owns and celebrates the cultural and linguistic diversity shaping our national identity... An identity woven with Arab-Islamic, Amazigh, Sahrawi-Hassani, African, Andalusian, Hebrew, and Mediterranean threads, as enshrined in the Kingdom's Constitution.

This year, the human rights pavilion will host more than 30 workshops to interact with children and their art and creativity, from the 12 regions of Morocco. More than 100 participants will engage in over 60 events on culture and cultural expressions.

From interactive panel discussions with children to book presentations and from conferences to discovering books and new publications, and from discussing literature to discussions, creativity and performances that capture Morocco's cultural richness.

All of this will take place in the Human Rights Pavilion; an open, accessible-for-all venue where culture becomes a bridge to human rights and a lever for development.

Moroccan culture is not merely a heritage and a past we celebrate, but a future we want to shape. Through this shared experience, we

will take you, visitors of the Human Rights Pavilion, on a journey. A journey through the richness of our country's artistic and creative diversity, where together we explore ways cultural expressions intersect with human rights and development. In doing so, we hope to contribute to this collective path of building and imagining.

With every stroke of a brush, every note played, and each letter traced by a pen, an opportunity for cultural growth is created, and one of our fundamental rights and freedoms is promoted.

ARTISTIC AND CREATIVE EXPRESSIONS


